Directory Requirements

In order to be a part of the Local Arts Agency Directory, organizations were required to meet at least two out of three of the criteria listed below.

- 1) We have, as our principal purpose, the provision of planning, financial support, services, programs and development opportunities for arts organizations, artists and the public, in a community or communities during a major portion of the year.
- 2) We involve, on a regular basis, activities, programs or services in more than one arts discipline (literary, media, performing and visual arts).
- 3) We are not a single-purpose organization, such as a theater, dance company, visual arts league, museum, orchestra, art school, or music ensemble, nor are we solely an arts presenter.

Terms

Arts Service Organizations: These are primarily service providers, rather than artistic producers or presenters. They offer administrative support, technical assistance, financial assistance, or service to a variety of arts professionals and disciplines. They may promote arts education or access for a specific community, arts discipline, cultural/artistic heritage, or underserved population.

Arts Producing: The primary focus is the creation, production, performance or exhibition of works of art.

Arts Presenting: A presenter typically organizes, selects, curates and contracts for events during the year, (i.e., concerts, plays, films, performances or appearances by creative artists, or ensembles of artists). Rather than creating the artistic event, the presenter acts as a sponsor for a season of performances or events for the community, and is often responsible for managing or leasing the facility where the arts events take place.

Community Arts Development (CAD) Program

The Community Arts Development (CAD) program provides opportunities and information about arts management to arts organizations and artists, so that they, in turn, can most effectively bring the arts to the public. CAD works to build the capacity of artists and organizations so that they are stable, continuous arts resources for their communities. CAD provides management information and assistance (sometimes called 'technical assistance' or TA) as well as guidance and encouragement. CAD works in partnership with local, regional, state and national organizations to provide these services. Arts organizations, artists, local arts councils and commissions, municipal governments and the general public make use of the program.

Note

Northwind Arts Alliance (NAA) was originally formed with an emphasis on the visual arts, but over the last six years the Alliance has expanded its mission and its reach throughout the community. Our stated mission is to “...connect the arts and community. We cultivate, promote, and encourage the arts; showcase and serve artists; and foster arts education and appreciation for the greater community of Port Townsend and Jefferson County.” Northwind is an IRS 501 (c) 3 tax exempt, non-profit organization, which operates the Northwind Arts Center at 2409 Jefferson St. in Port Townsend. The Board of Directors is a “working Board” of 12 members who make policy and, with the help of our members, implements most of the programs.

Alliance activities now include monthly poetry reading by local, regional and nationally known poets. Each reading includes discussion, analysis and gentle critique. Northwind has lately added poetry workshops given by leading literary figures of the Northwest. In May 2007, Madeline Defrees presented a workshop that involved attendees in writing, analysis, and critique of ideas.

Play readings featuring professional actors, of whom there are many in Port Townsend, are a twice-a-year event. The 75 person audiences are usually enthralled and most attend the post-play discussion about the play subject and its relationship to current or past complex social issues. NAA also works closely with the local theater organization, Key City Players, to arrange for special performances with post-performance discussions featuring current humanities issues.

As NAA is expanding its emphasis on all of the arts, increasing numbers of Port Townsend residents are attending the activities at Northwind Arts Center. Late in 2006 the Board recognized that an important segment of the community is missing from the events we sponsor. The seniors over 75 years old, who are residents in the specialized residential homes and care facilities, and are generally physically unable to come to the Center.
