<p>HB 2688</p>	<p>Authorizes cities to impose a temporary property tax increase to fund historic building rehabilitation; Requires a city that increases its levy to use the additional funds exclusively for the rehabilitation of historic buildings where there is a finding by the appropriate city official that designated buildings pose a significant risk to the public safety in the event of an earthquake.
