<p><b>HB 1763</b></p>	<p>Regulating music licensing agencies. Requires the department of licensing, in collaboration with the office of the attorney general, to conduct a consumer awareness campaign to inform business proprietors of their rights and responsibilities regarding the public performance of copyrighted music. 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<p><b>HB 2688</b></p>	<p>Authorizes cities to impose a temporary property tax increase to fund historic building rehabilitation; Requires a city that increases its levy to use the additional funds exclusively for the rehabilitation of historic buildings where there is a finding by the appropriate city official that designated buildings pose a significant risk to the public safety in the event of an earthquake.
