<b>CIP Code</b>	<i>Classification of Instructional Programs Code</i>	A federally accepted course code that identifies courses taught throughout the United States, this includes CTE courses (below). CIP codes are aligned to V-codes that clarify which courses the teacher has been certified to teach.
