ABOUT THE GOVERNOR'S ARTS & HERITAGE AWARDS

WHAT ARE THE GOVERNOR'S ARTS & HERITAGE AWARDS?	The Governor's Arts & Heritage Awards (GAHA) celebrate the arts and heritage of Washington State. They honor individuals and organizations that work tirelessly to ensure all Washingtonians have access to the arts. Hosted by the Washington State Arts Commission (ArtsWA), the annual GAHA celebration is the only statewide awards ceremony that recognizes individuals and organizations for their significant contributions to Washington's creative vitality. To be eligible for a GAHA, individuals or organizations must be current Washington residents or based in Washington during the time their contributions were made. Since 1966, over 260 Washington State artists and organizations have been honored with a GAHA.

WHO ATTENDS THE GAHA CELEBRATION?	More than 250 Washingtonians attend the annual GAHA event. They represent elected officials, artists, arts organizations, culture bearers, students and patrons of the arts and heritage. Each year, the event is hosted in a different community. This gives people from across the state access to ArtsWA's program, and allows those communities to highlight and share their artistic and cultural resources with their fellow Washingtonians.
WHY SPONSOR GAHA?	The Governor's Arts & Heritage Awards highlight the importance of arts and culture in Washington. The arts contribute to our quality of life. They preserve our unique cultural heritage. The arts foster our children's success in school. The arts attract business and tourism. There are more than 18,000 arts-based businesses in Washington, with well over 70,000 employees that drive significant economic activity in the state and spur tremendous social impact. 	ARTS COMMISSION
Anyone in Washington can nominate a person or organization for a GAHA. The nomination period opens on April 30, and ends on June 3. A selection panel evaluates nominations. Panel recommendations are forwarded to ArtsWA's board of commissioners. The Commission deliberates and forwards recommendations to the Governor, who has final approval authority. 
