


Guide for Getting a Unique Entity ID (SAM-UEI)

If you have an active or inactive registration in the federal System of Award Management (SAM.gov), you have already been assigned a Unique Entity ID (SAM-UEI). It is viewable on your entity registration record in SAM.gov

The easiest way to find your entity's Unique Entity ID (SAM-UEI) is to:

1. Log in to SAM.gov.
2. In your Workspace, select the numbered bubble above Active in the Entity Management widget.
