TAT Lab Core serves as a statewide community of practice; it is important to this model that all members of the cohort participate fully, which means attending all of the sessions as well as completing reading and learning plan development assignments.

The 2023-2024 Core Program meets for a total of 32 session hours between December 2023 and June 2024, with an additional 1-3 hours per month of independent work. Some sessions will meet as a full cohort (up to 30 participants) and some will meet as subcohorts (7-9 participants).
