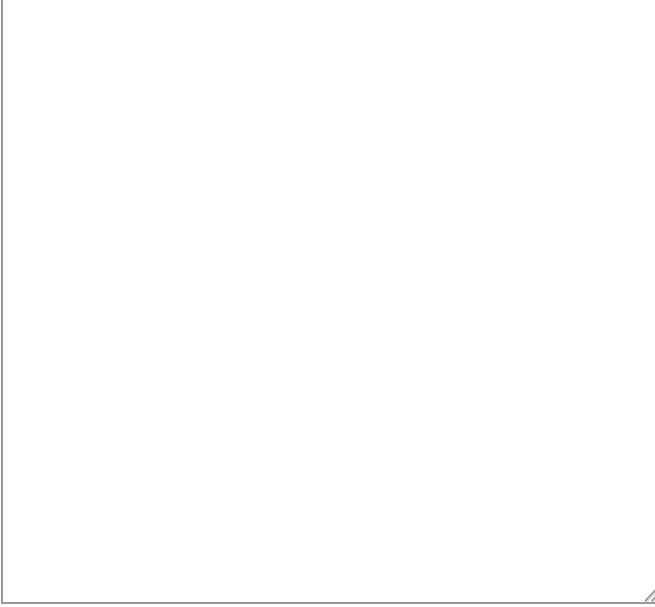

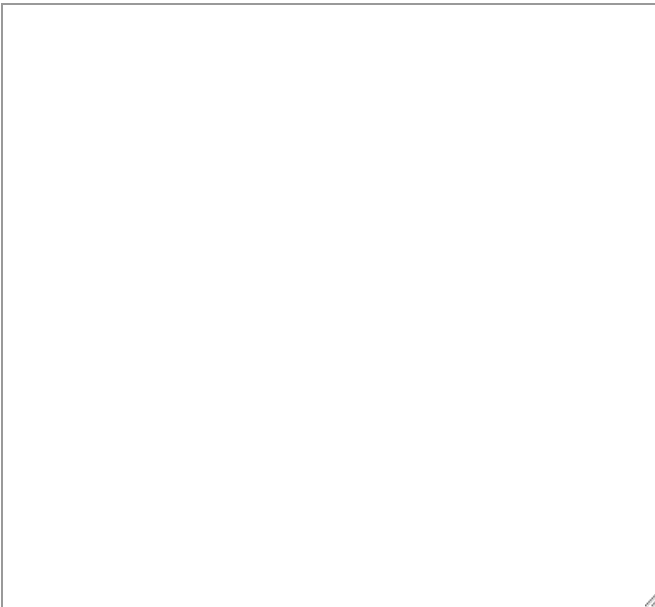

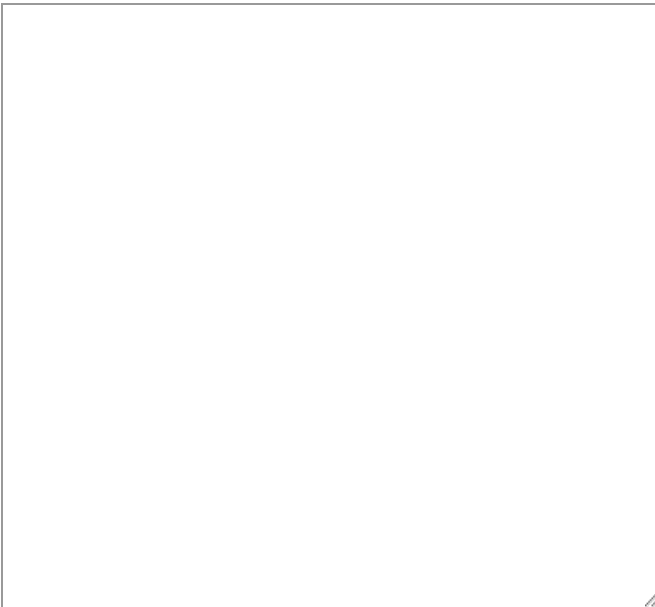

They meet three times: December 4-6, January 8-10, and March 4-6, each week on Mondays 4:00-6:00pm, Tuesdays 4:30-6:30pm or Wednesdays 5:00-7:00pm. If accepted, you will have an opportunity to indicate your availability for subcohort session times.
WHOLE COHORT SESSIONS (REMOTE)	The whole TAT Lab Core Program Cohort (up to 30 participants) meets Dec. 13 from 4:00-7:00pm, Jan. 31 from 4:00-7:00pm, Feb. 7 from 4:00-7:00pm, & June 5 from 4:00-8:00pm
WHOLE COHORT IN-PERSON GATHERING	April 20 and 21 from 9:30am-3:30pm each day, in the Seattle area. Lunch and snacks will be provided. Travel reimbursement is available for participants from outside King County, if requested. Lodging reimbursement is available for those traveling more than 60 miles.
1:1 FACULTY MENTOR COACHING (REMOTE)	Participants and their faculty mentor will schedule a mutually agreeable time for a one-on-one coaching session (approx. 45 minutes) on one day during late April or May; independent learning plan project work continues.

* 17. TAT Lab Core serves as a statewide community of practice; it is important to this model that all members of the cohort participate fully, which means attending all of the sessions as well as completing reading and learning plan development assignments.

The 2023-2024 Core Program meets for a total of 32 session hours between December 2023 and June 2024, with an additional 1-3 hours per month of independent work. Some sessions will meet as a full cohort (up to 30 participants) and some will meet as subcohorts (7-9 participants).

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* 18. Participant tuition for this program is \$500.
