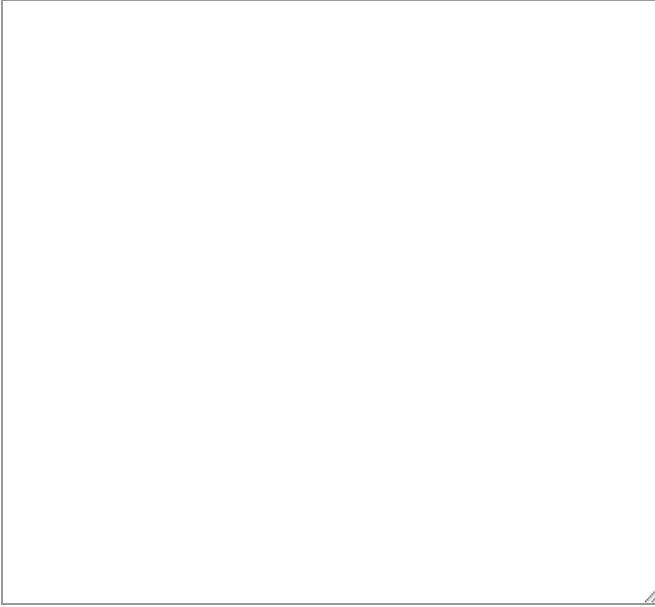

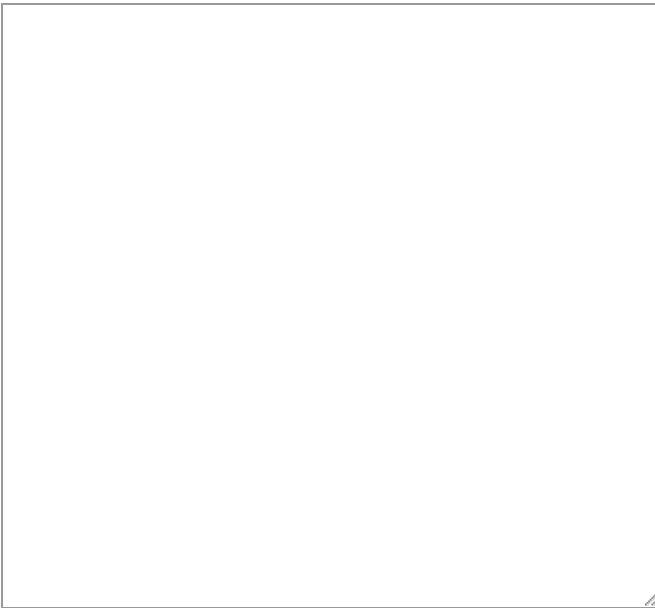

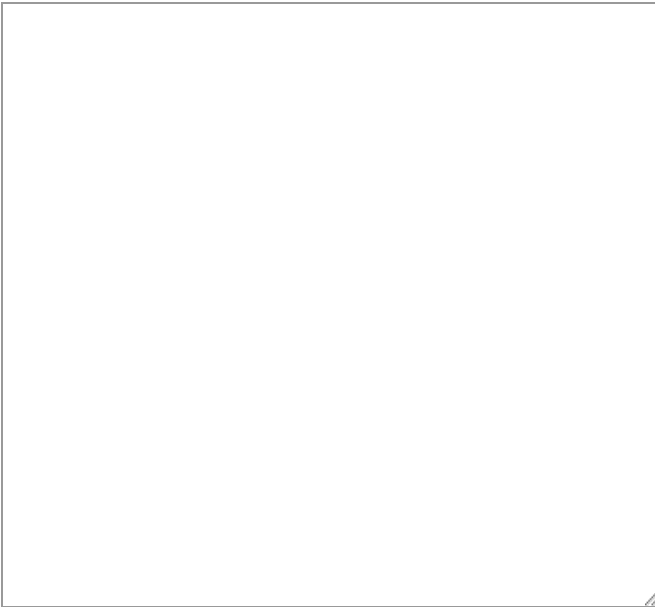

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<b>SUBCOHORT SESSIONS (REMOTE)</b>	Each TAT Lab Core Program participant will participate in a 7-9 person subcohort group led by a faculty mentor. They meet three times: December 2, 3 or 4; January 6, 7 or 8; and March 3, 4 or 5, each week on Mondays 4:00-6:00pm, Tuesdays 4:30-6:30pm or Wednesdays 5:00-7:00pm. If accepted, you will have an opportunity to indicate your availability for subcohort session times.
<b>WHOLE COHORT SESSIONS (REMOTE)</b>	The whole TAT Lab Core Program Cohort (up to 30 participants) meets Wednesdays: Dec. 11 from 4:00-7:00pm, Jan. 29 from 4:00-7:00pm, Feb. 5 from 4:00-7:00pm, and May 14 from 4:00-8:00pm
<b>WHOLE COHORT IN-PERSON GATHERING</b>	Saturday & Sunday April 5 & 6 from 9:30am-3:30pm each day, in Seattle. Lunch and snacks will be provided. Travel reimbursement is available for participants from outside King County, if requested. Lodging reimbursement is available for those traveling more than 60 miles.
<b>1:1 FACULTY MENTOR COACHING (REMOTE)</b>	Participants and their faculty mentor will schedule a mutually agreeable time for a one-on-one coaching session (approx. 45 minutes) after April 7 and before May 11; independent learning plan project work continues.

TAT Lab staff take attendance. **To officially complete the program, participants must miss no more than 3 hours of TAT Lab.** See Attendance Policy for details.

TAT Lab Core Program serves as a statewide community of practice; it is important to this model that all members of the cohort participate fully, which means attending all of the sessions as well as completing reading and learning plan development assignments.

The TAT Lab Core Program meets for a total of 32 session hours between December and May, with an additional 1-3 hours per month of independent work. Some sessions will meet as a full cohort (up to 30 participants) and some will meet as subcohorts (7-9 participants).
