Remember the power of crafts, like woodworking, textiles, and jewelry making.


Shift the dialogue from secondary benefits of arts education, like corporate creativity. Move toward how it transforms the cultural landscape we live in.

LISTEN!

Increase town hall meetings across the state and actively seek out youth to participate.

Ask families why arts education is important and really listen to what they say.

INCREASE ACCESS

Ensure students with disabilities can access arts learning opportunities.

Provide music education to young learners, allowing students to build deep skills and knowledge to share with the world.

Ensure youth can attend arts and cultural events by making tickets affordable for them and their families.

Make space for youth to share their creative work with their communities through exhibitions and performances.

Provide career-connected pathways for young artists and students interested in the creative economy.

Support teen-centered community spaces and make sure youth across the state can access them.

Provide arts learning opportunities for youth who have the least access.

Provide more media arts and film learning resources for students.

Create more internships and career pathway opportunities within the creative industry.

PROMOTE

Amplify community cultural events that youth can participate in.

Encourage the study of art history and global understanding in Kindergarten - Grade 12 schools.

Recognize and support the amazing work of arts teachers working in our schools.

INVEST

Do more than just celebrate arts education - **FUND IT**.

Fund arts education just as you would other activities known to increase student engagement, like sports or leadership programs.

Work with schools to fund and promote student arts competitions at the same level as other career and technical student organizations.

Fund libraries for youth access to information.
